### 4. First Aid Measures

**Emergency and First Aid Procedures:**

- In Case of Inhalation:** Remove from exposure and move to fresh air immediately. Get medical aid. Consult a physician. If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen.

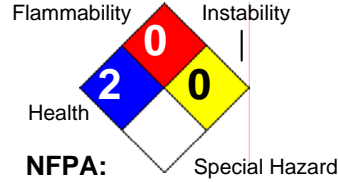
